The Hall was built in 1972 and has gone from being a hub of activity to, more recently, an under-used resource. Due to its current condition and high maintenance cost, there have been discussions about refurbishing, altering or rebuilding the Hall. The Community Hall Management Committee, as part of their considerations towards planning for the Hall's future, wish to know your views. As a result of the survey the Police are also looking at specific places and times to locate mobile radar cameras along the lane.
