The shop also sells stamps, National Lottery tickets, offers a cash back service, and is an EVRi drop off/collection point.

A Time For Goodwill and Giving!

At this time of year, as many of us are planning celebrations with family and friends, we also think of others less fortunate than ourselves. That is why the Community Plan Group have organised a 'Drop & Go' community donation weekend Fri 1st - Sun 3rd December in support of Irlam & Cadishead Foodbank who support those in need in the local community. Rixton-with-Glazebrook Community Hall

The Hall committee have been busy managing the Hall and raising funds to improve the facilities. In Summer 2023 a paved patio area was installed at the back of the Hall, funded by Entrust Community Landfill Fund. Plans are also in hand to install benches and planters on the patio. New fencing has also been installed and a new floor cleaner and 40 new chairs purchased.



On 25th September weekly Community Coffee was given over to supporting the MacMillan Coffee Morning. Over 100 people attended and, together with the hard work of the regular volunteers, raised £427.40 for a good cause. Community Coffee is held every Monday morning 10.30am -12.30pm. With Christmas Day being a Monday, one is being held on Wednesday 27th December instead.

Film Nights at the hall re-commenced on Friday 6th October with a showing fortnightly up until the end of March - see dates on the Hall's 'What's On' page.

A celebratory evening was held in the Hall in October with 104 guests representing the Community Group they volunteer for. The Hamilton Davies Trust team proudly hosted the event to highlight the many volunteering activities that take place



within the Parish and in neighbouring Cadishead and Irlam.



The Hall committee wish to thank the Rotary Club of Irlam who have replanted the 2 tiered planters with primulas to bring some early Spring colour to the front of the Hall.

Community Plan Group

Community Plan volunteers meet 3 or 4 times a year to plan Action Days to help improve the 'Look and Feel' of the Parish and to see how they can support activities to bring the community together. Since June 2023 the Group volunteers have organised a guided walk, litter picked, cleaned signs and planted 1,000 more English Bluebells in Glamis Wood, supported Community Hall events.



Thank You to the volunteers who picked up 33 bags of other people's rubbish at the Litter Pick held in June, as well as 4 wheels, 1 barrier and a carpet. Thanks also to those kind individual 'Litter Legends' who pick litter on a regular basis keeping the Parish looking cared for. The next Group litter pick is on **Sunday 11th February 10am-12noon**. Meet at the Black Swan car park. Litter picks and hi vis provided.

In July 40 walkers turned out for an evening guided walk, despite the cloudy skies and muddy conditions! It is especially pleasing to show those new to the area, or simply visiting, the extent of our beautiful rural footpaths.

In August volunteers removed overhanging foliage and cleaned the road signs around the Parish. The signs were previously cleaned 3 years ago and have lasted well - they certainly look a lot brighter than many outside the parish!

For the seventh time running the Group have organised a 'Drop & Go' collection in December in support of Irlam & Cadishead Foodbank.



Message from Rixton-with-Glazebrook Parish Council (PC) Chair - Maureen Banner

"I write this having recently been to our Remembrance Service at St Helen's Church to honour the fallen who served with courage, bravery and loyalty. Traditionally in our service, the names of the fallen are read out and I had the honour this year of reading the memorable lines 'We Will Remember Them' - poignant words reminding us all of the great sacrifice of those who gave their lives, serving and protecting our country. The silence and stillness of over 200 people paying their respects was very moving. I laid our poppy wreath, followed by many other local organisations. The visiting vicar remarked on the fantastic turnout on a drab and miserable morning. For me and many more, this was an uplifting and memorable experience.

Over the last three months, the Parish has dealt with its usual post bag of tree and hedge cutting, litter, etc. We have heard that the planning application for the 120 houses will be heard in December. The Development Management Committee will be visiting the site in the next few weeks. Community grants recently given amounted to approximately £1,570 including: Friends of Glazebrook Station bench; Community Parish News; Community Plan Group bulbs; Pre-school; and Indoor Bowling Group. My thanks to all members of the Council. Every good wish for a happy, peaceful, joyous Christmas shared with family and friends."
