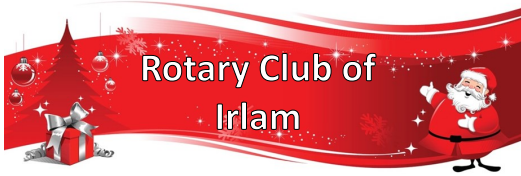

## Churches

As well as weekly services (check out church notice boards for times) St. Helens C of E Church, Rixton Methodist, and Glazebrook Methodist all host weddings, christenings, funerals and coffee mornings - see Contacts page for who to call for more details.

**Rixton Methodist** is home to Rixton Tots - Thursdays 9.30 - 11.30am term-time only - cost £3 for parent/carer and 1 child with £1 for any further children.
