The hall continues to be a busy and vibrant community hub, hosting a wide range of activities and bookings, including IT courses, weddings, birthday parties, dog shows, drama performances, concerts, and many other events. The hall has successfully secured funding for the installation of solar panels and air conditioning, which will be fitted during the summer. These improvements will significantly reduce future energy costs whilst enhancing comfort for hall users.

In January, the Community Coffee Morning celebrated its fourth anniversary. Everyone is welcome to join us on Monday mornings from 10:00 am to 12:00 pm for hot drinks, delicious treats, and friendly conversation. Dogs and well-behaved children are also very welcome. Visitors can also take advantage of the hall's extensive book and jigsaw exchange.

Warburtons continues to generously donate 100 bread items every Monday. These are enjoyed at the Coffee Morning and distributed to local schools, community groups, and Warrington Salvation Army.

The committee wish to thank the children of St Helen's School, who regularly visit to sing at the hall, as well as to Warrington Disability Partnership, Birchwood Fire Service, Greater Manchester Police, and Cheshire Police for their ongoing support and regular visits.



Friday Film Nights return on Friday 9 October, with doors opening at 7pm. Guests are welcome to bring their own drinks and snacks. Details of upcoming films will be displayed in the foyer.

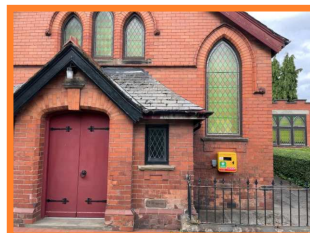

Community Plan Group

Community Plan volunteers meet 3 times a year to plan Action Days to improve the 'Look and Feel' of the Parish.

Since December the group have organised 2 litter picks, a Winter guided walk, and the installation of a new Publicly Accessible Defibrillator on Chapel Lane. Total cost, including installation parts, was £1773 so again a massive thank you to all who kindly contributed including the Community Plan Group, Parish Council and several local businesses. In January 16 people and 3 dogs wrapped up and joined our Guided Winter Walk along the footpaths and lanes around the parish, which were extra scenic being dusted with snow and glistening in the sunlight.

In February, 14 volunteers collected 39 bags of litter,



and in June, 10 volunteers collected ??? bags. Thanks to the Black Swan for free hot drinks afterwards and also to individuals who kindly pick up litter on a regular basis, together we help to keep the Parish looking cared for. 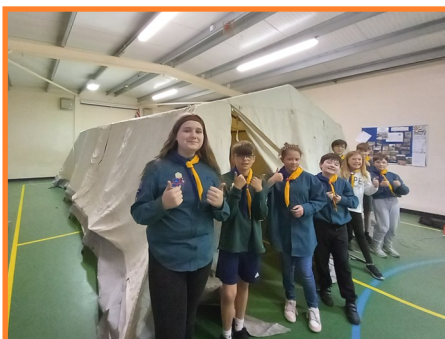

Message from Rixton-with-Glazebrook Parish Council (PC)

Chair - Julie Eastty

“Much of the Council’s work happens behind the scenes: responding to residents’ concerns, supporting community initiatives, and keeping the parish running smoothly.

Our finances remain stable and well managed. The parish precept has been used responsibly to fund essential work while keeping spending under control. We have maintained a sensible reserve for future needs. End of year accounts are available on the parish website, and the annual audit has given us a clean bill of health.

The Parish Council (PC) has supported several local groups, including contributions to the Pre-school, the Community Plan Group, and the Friends of Hollinfare Cemetery. We also contributed to a new defibrillator at Rixton Methodist Chapel. We remain extremely grateful to all volunteers, residents, and community groups whose time and effort make a real difference.

We continue to raise concerns with Warrington Borough Council (WBC) , the police, and local councillors about speeding hotspots in the parish. The number of incidents and near misses is worrying, and we will keep pressing the authorities for action. We are aware of a possible new housing development on Manchester Road and will be keeping a close eye on any plans submitted to WBC. We know how important this is to our community, and we’ll make sure residents are kept informed. Updates via PC minutes on our website.”
